The ethos of LINK19 College has been developed with four core values:
























PROVISION

LINK19 College aims to provide an outstanding and supportive learning environment which allows everyone to succeed with high self-esteem and respect for others so they are able to take their place in the community with confidence and pride.

Our aim is to:

- support and challenge learners to achieve success
- provide schedules to develop employability and life skills
- create personalised pathways to prepare for life within the community with appropriate support

LINK19 College provides flexible pathways offering a range of accreditation that is adapted to meet each learner's needs, whilst increasing their independence at a suitable pace.

LINK19 College offer the following pathways:

- Catering
- Retail
- Hospitality
- Construction and Ground Maintenance
- Horticulture and Animal Care

All learners will continue to learn Functional Skills Maths and English; all pathways are also supported by relevant work placements.





ADMISSION

Eligibility criteria for admission to LINK19 College:

- Learners are only eligible for a place if they have an Education,
 Health and Care Plan and LINK19 College identified as a suitable placement named in the learner's EHCP.
- Learners are only eligible if LINK19 College is suitable as a provision for the learner.
- Learners are only eligible if they are able, with support, to develop key employability and life skills.

In addition:

- The nature of the learner's needs and previous educational experience are not detrimental to the safety and well-being of all learners educated at LINK19 College.
- Learners needs and educational requirements cannot be met in mainstream provision

All places are subject to availability of funding. Staff and LINK19 College will assess referred learners in their existing provision (if possible) before their place is confirmed. This is to ensure that the college is able to meet learner's needs. Formal risk assessments may be necessary to identify the medical or care needs of an individual in order to determine suitability and/or compatibility with the needs of existing learners.







OUR COLLEGE

At LINK19 College we offer a highly personalised and inclusive approach to learning. We empower learners to take ownership of their own destiny by supporting them to progress and achieve to the best of their ability. We develop their confidence and support them in learning the necessary skills needed in the next stage of their life.

We aim to provide a happy and calm environment to enable learners to develop their confidence through effort, success and praise.

Supported work placements enable some Post 19 learners to take their previous work experiences to the next level.

The learners work alongside a Work Placement Support Worker who will provide practical guidance and practical clarification within a placement.

LINK19 College is fortunate to have a host of partner organisations who share our vision for young people with SEND. Like LINK19 College they recognise that learners can make a real contribution in the work place whilst developing skills in their chosen pathway. We are developing the range of organisations in our community who are making a valuable contribution to LINK19 College learners' progress.
